## **“THE CHANDRAYAAN’S MISSION: INDIA’S VOYAGE TO THE MOON (VIDEO SHOW)”**

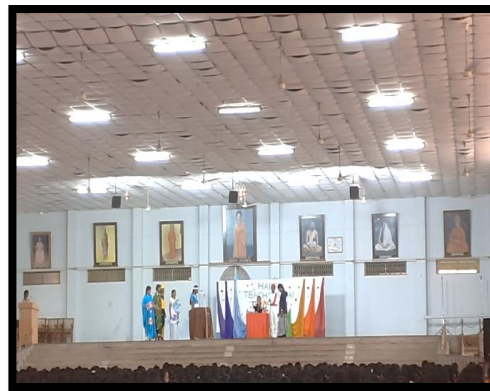

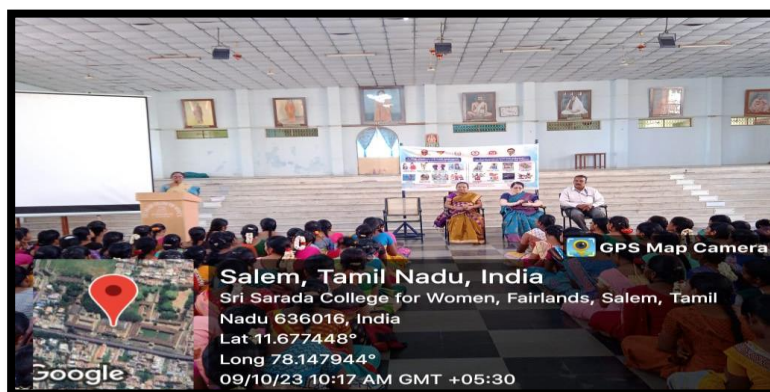


## A PLEDGE ON SOCIAL JUSTICE DAY

## NAVARATHIRI NAMAVALI

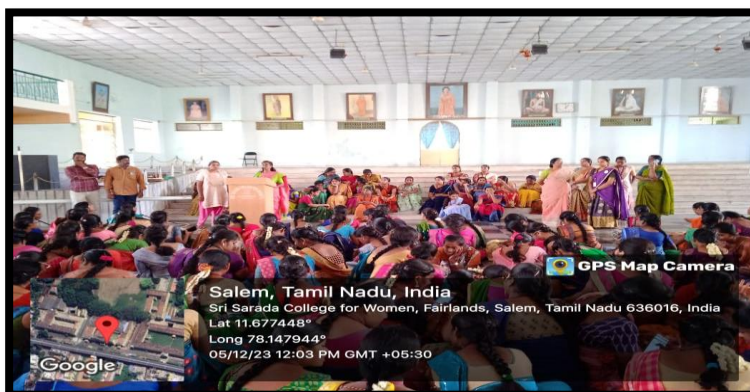

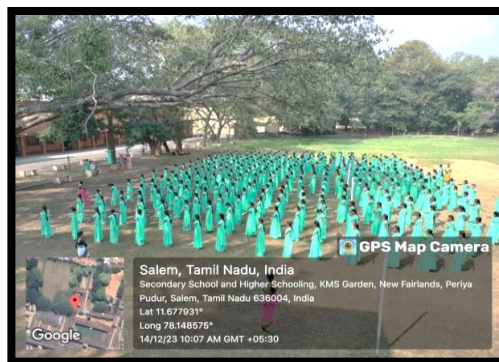
## FIT INDIA WEEK 2023 CELEBRATION

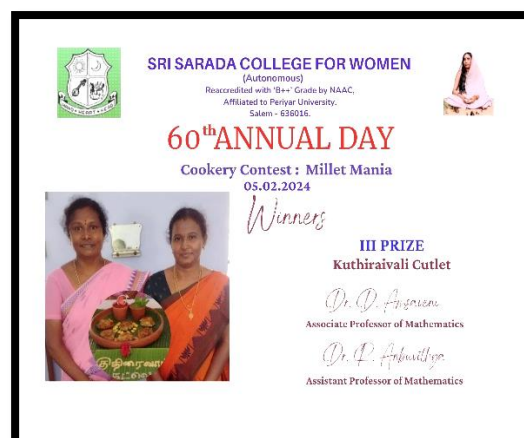
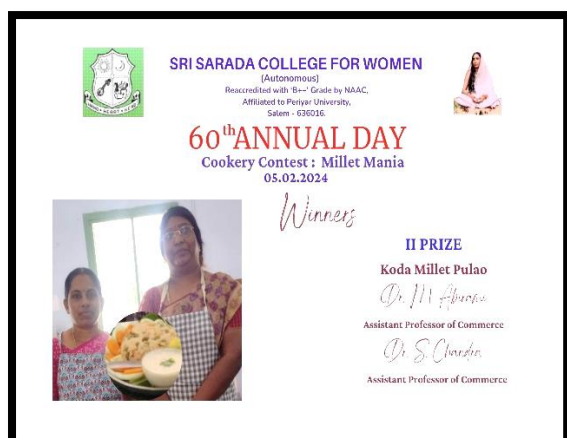
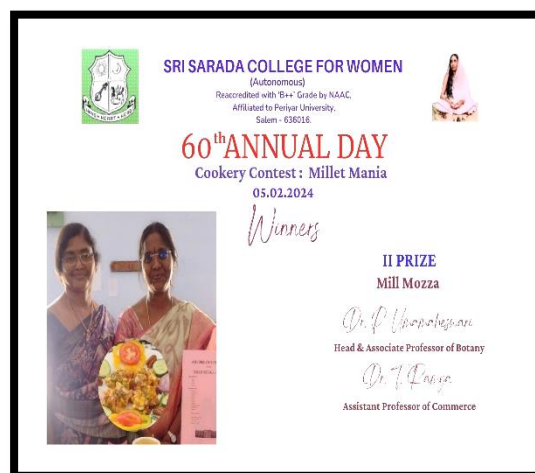
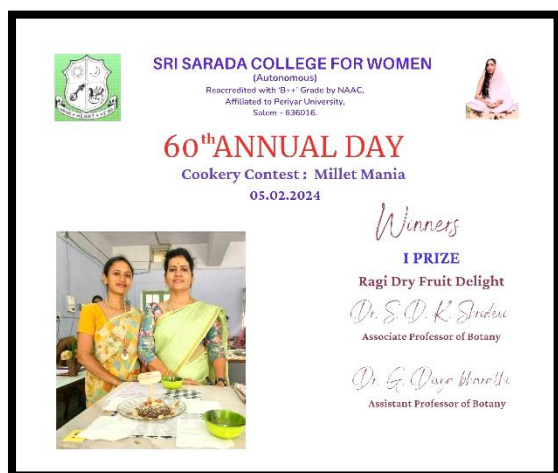
## **60<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL DAY CELEBRATIONS**

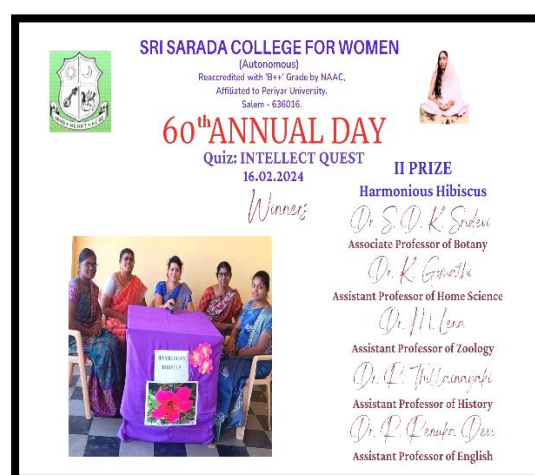
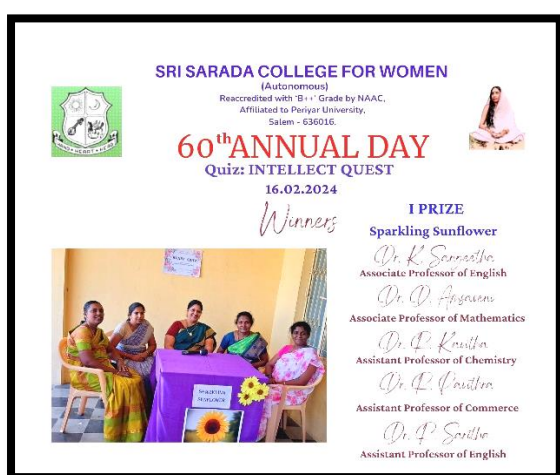
## REPORT ON TALENT EXPO: THE 60

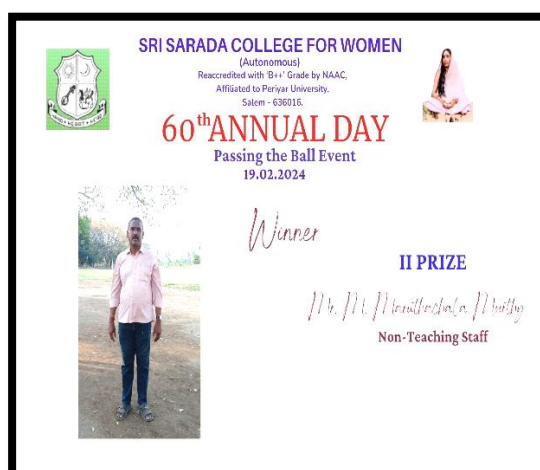
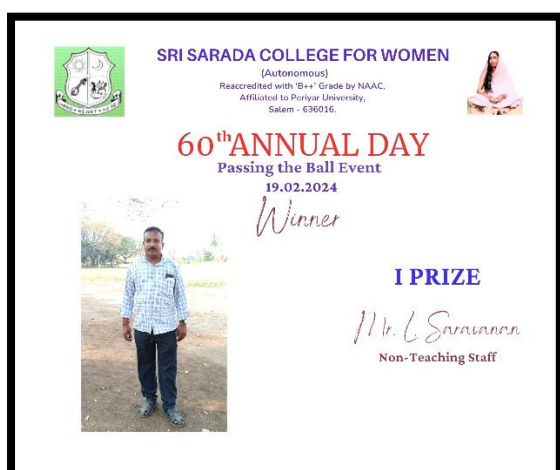

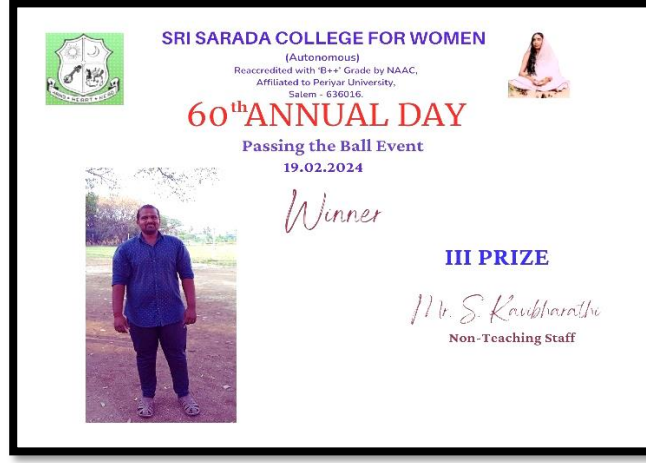
